Clement Attlee won the prime ministry and ascended to power in 1945 amidst the end of the Second World War. As the committee comes to end, we will come to an election where delegates will compete against one another for a chance to gain power within Britain. Be ready to face a struggling British population, extreme economic tensions, and an election amongst your fellow delegates!
