

RAHMBO: FIRST BLOOD - RAHM EMANUEL'S FIRST TERM, 2011

It's 2011. Problems in Chicago are reaching critical mass. Incumbent Richard M. Daley's six-term reign has come to an end when, in a historic move, he chose not to seek reelection. The proceeding election was one of the most contested in Chicago's history, with the most candidates to ever appear on a single ballot since 1919. Welcome to the stage, Rahm Emanuel.
