

UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL, 1988

As one of the six principal organs of the United Nations, the United Nations Security Council is charged with ensuring international peace and security. As the only UN body with the authority to issue binding resolutions on member states, the tumultuous time period of the late 1980s and early 1990s will challenge the delegates of the Security Council to think critically and act swiftly as they address issues from across the world. From civil unrest and armed conflict to economic crisis and ecological catastrophe, the countries of the UNSC will have to work together to brave the challenges that history throws at them – from every region in the world. The topic that the United Nations Security Council will have to address this year is open, meaning that any prevalent issue from any region of the world in the late 1980s and early 1990s will be something that the UNSC will have to address. In other words, the United Nations Security Council topic for ChoMUN XXVI is The World. **This committee begins in August 1988**.
