



UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL, 2022

In early November, 2020, fighting broke out in the Tigray region of Ethiopia between the Tigray People's Liberation Front (TPLF) and the Ethiopian National Defense Force. This followed months of tensions between the Ethiopian government and the TPLF, a deposed political group which formerly held power in the federal government. As the fighting escalated, other military groups became embroiled in the conflict, including troops from the Amhara region of Ethiopia and neighboring Eritrea. The conflict also contributed to a massive humanitarian crisis, with millions of people in the Tigray region displaced or lacking food. The Tigray War poses an intersection of political, humanitarian, and military issues that threaten to destabilize not only the nation of Ethiopia, but all of East Africa. The United Nations Security Council must examine which actors are contributing to the conflict, and how the conflict can be defused without spreading it to surrounding nations. Most importantly, delegates on the UNSC will have to create solutions to alleviate Tigray's humanitarian crisis and protect its people from further harm. The committee will be present-day, starting in April 2022.

This will be a double delegation committee.
