

YOU MISS ALL THE SHOTS YOU DON'T TAKE: INTERNATIONAL BIOETHICS COMMITTEE, 2022

At the turn of the twenty-first century, an array of fast-paced scientific advances touched everything from the stars to our cells. In some of these advances, scientists challenged foundational notions of ethics and morality, and calls for regulation and oversight became deafening as clinical trials for new medical treatments expanded. With issues spanning the implementation of informed consent, guidelines for keeping trial participants safe, and the impacts these trials have on the communities and countries they take place in, the public has called on experts from across the world and disciplines to convene at the International Bioethics Committee to create guidelines for countries to follow in order to bring uniformity and accountability to the global implementation of clinical trials. This session of the International Bioethics Committee greatly depends on the voices of scientists and non-scientists alike to restore public confidence in science and secure international guardrails on scientific progress for the future.
